# **COURSE WORK**

One Semester of course work equals 5 credits, 10 credits equaling 1 year of course work. Taking seven courses each semester for four years and completing community service allows the student to complete 290 credits. Credit requirements listed under graduation requirements are the minimum requirements for graduation. Additional course work in Mathematics, Science, and Foreign Language is recommended by the UC and California State University systems. Seniors will graduate on May 29, 2016.
