












OUR MISSION

Cardinal Newman is located in the wine producing area of Sonoma County. Santa Rosa is fifty miles north of San Francisco and has a population of approximately 175,000. COURSE WORK

One semester of course work equals 5 credits, 10 credits equaling 1 year of course work. Taking seven courses each semester for four years and completing community service allows the student to complete 290 credits. The 270 credits listed under Graduation Requirements are the minimum to graduate. Additional course work in Modern & Classical Languages, Mathematics and Science is recommended by the UC and California State University systems.




